Summary of the numbers of credit at each level which will comprise the Diploma	All Diplomas are 60 credits, irrespective of the place, subject or mode of study. Of the 60 credits 45 must be at Level 3 from graded units concerned with academic subject content, with the remaining 15 to be achieved at Level 2 or Level 3 from ungraded units.
Credit value and level of mandatory units	You must successfully achieve all units to achieve your diploma.
Credit value and level of Optional units	0 credits at Level 2 and 0 credits at Level 3 to be achieved through the choice of specified optional units.
Human Biology available credits	You have the opportunity to earn up to 21 credits across the 7 graded Human Biology units- we recommend all students check their university's entry requirements.
Credit value and level of credits permitted through credit transfer and the award of credit through the recognition of prior learning(RPL)	The RPL and credit transfer rules can be applied to both mandatory and optional units. No more than 30 credits required for the Access to HE Diploma award may be awarded through RPL or credit transfer. No credit is awarded where previous learning has already been certificated; students will be exempt from relevant credit requirements. RPL or credit exemption will normally be awarded only for subjects or units relevant to the named Diploma.
